Hark, the Voice of Jesus Calling

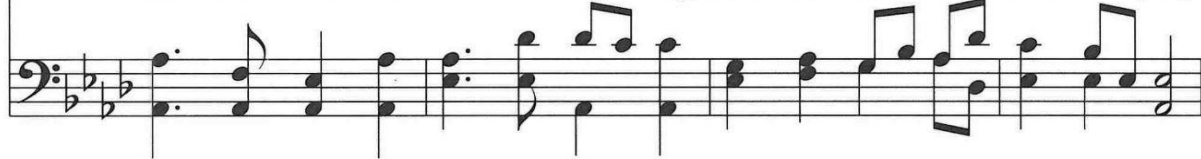
I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send?" — Isaiah 6:8 NIV

The Nazi appropriation of this tune for propaganda purposes has clouded a noble piece of music first associated with this text in 1889. In a 1779 collection, the author indicated that this hymn is primarily based on Isaiah 33:20–21 with allusions to several other passages.

Doxology

The musical score is written for two voices, Treble and Bass, in a G major key (one sharp) and 4/4 time. It consists of three systems of music. Each system has a vocal line and a piano accompaniment line. The lyrics are: 'Praise God, from whom all blessings flow; praise Christ, all people here below; praise Holy Spirit ever more; praise Tri-une God, whom we adore. Amen.' The melody is simple and hymn-like, with a steady rhythm. The piano accompaniment provides harmonic support with chords and moving lines.
