# God & the Environment

Years ago, whenever I mentioned ecotheology, I had to begin by justifying it. To some people, a creation-centered approach to understanding God seemed weird, at best, or, in the worst-case scenario, an anathema. This made me cautious. I avoided using the word 'ecotheology'. Instead, we would have studies on creation care or some similar ecotheological euphemism. How the times have changed!

Now, we accept God's love for the world, including the plants, animals, earth, sky, and sea. We acknowledge anthropomorphic climate change, and we recognize the need to do something about it. Wild fires, floods, and other weather anomalies highlight the impending existential crisis facing humanity.

In the 1994 book *Ecotheology: Voices from the South and North* (Orbis), David Hallman wrote a chapter on "Ethics and Sustainable Development." Recently, I was rereading sections of the book and encountered the following quote: "The church cannot claim a monopoly on ethics; indeed when it comes to applying ethics to environment and development, we find that some of our secular colleagues have done more serious thinking than we have" (264).

Hallman is partially correct now and was completely right in 1994. The church still cannot claim a monopoly on ethics. We recognize this and learn from other faiths, philosophies, and world views. For example, from Buddhist meditation, we can learn how to pray in a deeper way. However, in the second part, Hallman is only partially correct now. Back then, few people of faith were applying biblical ethics to the way we treat the environment. Now, many Christ-followers openly explore how faith connects with God's creation.
