Our Journey to Easter

Tomorrow is Ash Wednesday. This is the day that marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is the 40-day period (not including Sundays) before Easter. For many people, it is a period of fasting, moderation, and self-denial. However, these activities are not the purpose of Lent. The purpose is to prepare for Easter.

In Matthew 6:16, Jesus says, "Whenever you fast, do not look dismal like the hypocrites." They fast for the purpose of fasting. Hypocrites fast to make sure everyone knows they are fasting. It's phony and disingenuous. Jesus warns against the hypocrisy of doing things for show.

In our faith journeys, everything we do should have a reason. Doing something so that other people see us doing it is exactly what Jesus warned people about. Lent is not about the fasting, moderation, or self-denial. Ash Wednesday is not about getting a little ashy cross on our foreheads.

Instead, Ash Wednesday and Lent are about getting ready for the glory of Easter. To get to Easter, we must prepare. We prepare by fasting. Fasting helps us take our eyes off the things of this world and focus on God. Moderation is always a good practice. During Lent, it is especially meaningful because it serves as a reminder of our commitment to God.

We can fast in a number of ways. The obvious one is to refrain from eating for some period of time. We can also fast from something specific. This is why we hear about people giving up something for Lent, like chocolate or coffee. We can fast from social media or television or video streaming.

In 2022, First United Church in Oak Park, IL, fasted from "whiteness," meaning they didn't sing any hymns composed by a white person during Lent. Although I don't feel led to join that particular fast, reading about it made me think, and that's the point.

The ashes of Ash Wednesday are not about the outward sign. They are not intended to be a banner to show others that we went to church on Ash Wednesday. They remind us of our mortality. "You are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). We begin Lent with the reminder that our bodies are mortal. This reminder marks the beginning of the journey to the cross and the empty tomb.

The Lenten journey includes remembering, preparing, and thinking. Anything we do that brings to mind our mortality and dependence on God can enrich our experience. When we put effort into Lent, Easter becomes brighter and more beautiful than we ever imagined.
