# Changing to Follow God NWATCH

In *Basic Ecclesial Communities* (Quezon City, Philippines: Claretian 1983), *José Marins writes the following parable:* 

It was Manolito's fifth birthday. To celebrate, his mother bought him a sailor suit which fit him perfectly. His aunt taught him to sing, "Row, row, row your boat..." But since Manolito still could not pronounce the 'r', the words came out "Low, low, low your boat..." The childish lisp, together with his new suit, made Manolito all the cuter, and he became the pride and joy of his family.

They took him everywhere—to his grandparents' house, to his aunts, uncles, relatives, and neighbors—showing off his suit and singing his song. Everyone laughed and smiled, and they gave him candy and treats.

Many years after that, everyone in the family could remember with nostalgia the sailor suit and the song. It meant so much when Manolito was five years old.

### Time passed.

Manolito is now twenty-one-year-old Manolo. He has changed radically. He is a handsome, strong, young man but with one peculiarity—he continues to be attached to his old sailor suit, singing "Low, low, low your boat..." each year on his birthday. But things are very different now.

Even though it is the same song, the same clothes, the same Manolo, the same city, and the same relatives, the reaction is different. It is not as before. What was once a smashing success is now absolutely ridiculous. Manolo is no longer the pride and joy of his family but the embarrassment of everyone. People wonder whether he is acting like a clown or has gone mad.

When we look at the way we do what we do now, how are we clutching the little sailor suit and singing, "Low, low, low your boat..."? Jesus said, "And no one puts new wine into old wineskins; otherwise, the wine will burst the skins, and the wine is lost, and so are the skins; but one puts new wine into fresh wineskins" (Mark 2:22). We need wineskins for today. We must change as God leads us to change and not hold things that no longer feed our souls.

The challenge for us is to examine everything we do in the light of the Holy Spirit, let go of the vestiges of the past, and hold fast to the light of Christ.

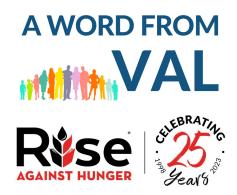

### AED & CPR Training and Health & Wellness Ministry

Would you like to receive training on how to use our church's AED or how to perform CPR? CPR is an emergency life-saving procedure performed when the heart has stopped beating. The benefits of performing immediate CPR "Hands-only" (NO mouth-to-mouth contact) FAR outweighs any risks and can double or triple chances of survival. ANYONE can easily use the AED (in conjunction with CPR), without fear of causing harm. The AED machine analyzes the person's heart rhythm and will announce EXACTLY what to do.....or, not do. Getting more people trained will keep all of us safer. If you are interested in receiving training on either or both, please let <u>Linda</u> know in the church office. She will keep a list and will let you know when we schedule the training. Also, if you are already currently CPR trained, we would like to know that as well. ### Making Disciples

Jesus commanded, "Go and make disciples." By definition a disciple is, according to

Dictionary.com: "noun – a person who is a pupil or an adherent of the doctrines of another."

Specifically, a distinction is stated under "Religion": one of the 12 personal followers of Christ; one of the 70 followers sent forth by Christ in

Luke 10:1; any other professed follower of Christ - thus ALL followers of Christ.

Hey! That's YOU and ME! Have you never thought of yourself as a "disciple?" Did you think you weren't qualified? Refer back to the first paragraph, last part of last sentence: "ALL followers of Christ."

In this Baptist world in which many of us grew up, the church relegated "disciple making" to Disciple-ship Training (aka Church Training, Training Union). I will not take time to delve into what happened there. But suffice it to say that Sunday Bible Study IS our endeavor to "make us disciples." Like our younger generations, there are groups of adult-devoted disciples who meet for fellowship, unity, prayer, and to explore God's Word for us today.

If you are not currently attending, or thanks to COVID-19 stopped attending, and sense a spiritual desire to connect with others in your walk as a Christ follower, I encourage you to consider the offerings we have. Over the next several weeks, I will offer introductions for some, and a refresher for others, to know the various adult class offerings you may choose from to continue your journey of becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ.

This week I would like to introduce to you the "Seekers Class." This is a coed, intergenerational class using a variety of writers and Biblical topics in creative discussion that begins at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday mornings. This class was so capably led by Jack Averill until just recently. Currently, Matt Tennant is leading the class. They meet on the Ground Floor, Room G-14/The Parlor. They are well-organized and encourage everyone to check on each other for encouragement and prayer.

Also, the "Young Professionals" is a group of graduate students and young adults in their mid-20s to mid-30s. Ben Chenault and Daniel Harper facilitate discussions of Scripture using various resources and study guides the class agrees upon. Everyone receives a warm welcome and invitation to join in the study of God's Word.

# **National Missions Offering**

Each Spring UBC has participated in the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship's National Missions Offering. This emphasis helps support our missionaries right here in the US. UBC's offering supports the ministry of Scarlette Jasper, a CBF missionary working in southeastern Kentucky, where UBC has been partnering with missionaries for many years. Scarlette was commissioned by the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship as a field missionary in 2014 and now serves one of the poorest parts of the United States. There, she is the director of Olive Branch Ministries, Inc., which works to address the needs of the local community. Some of the many needs that Scarlette helps address are working with the homeless,

coordinating children's literacy projects, rent and utility aid, assisting with transportation costs for distant medical appointments, providing heaters or propane in the winter, supporting local schools with supplies, and helping veterans get needed services. She maintains a small mission house that serves as an emergency shelter and place for pastoral counseling. You can see her most recent projects on her <u>Facebook page</u>. Even through the challenges of the pandemic, Scarlette has remained active in her community to help with their needs.

Like the majority of our field missionaries, Scarlette must raise her own program and project support. Our goal this year is to raise \$3,000 to support Scarlette and her work in Kentucky.
