# Raising the Stakes

How does ecotheology connect faith and our priorities? Since the early 1970s, caring for the environment has been gaining ground. In the early 2000s, we began learning more about climate change and humanity's role in worsening storms, wildfires, and other ecological disasters. Now, caring for creation is widely accepted as the right thing to do.

I can see the results of connecting what is important to us with our faith. Before people walk in the sanctuary, we care about the environment. When our gospel lesson and Wednesday night studies foster this connection, people get inspired. The results are tangible. The following ideas all came from you.

First, starting in October, we will have glass communion cups and stop throwing 150 plastic cups away once per month. Second, in the very near future, we will begin composting through Black Bear Composting. Our dinnerware, food scraps, and other compostable materials from Wednesday and Sunday nights will no longer go to landfills. Instead, it will become high quality soil. Third, we are continuing to explore putting solar panels on the flat portion of our roof. The improved efficiency of solar panels, decreasing costs, and a change in the tax law have come together to make this project seem viable. Fourth, although less visible than other projects, changing from a fixed-speed pump in our HVAC system to a variable-speed pump could save the church as much as \$5,000 per year. That saving is not only good for the church budget, but it's also good for the environment. A variable-speed pump represents a reduction of thousands of kWh of electricity.
