Baptismal Joy

Someone asked me on Sunday, "Is [baptism] the biggest kick a minister gets?"

It seemed like the question pointed to the best of what anyone gets to do in their work or calling, and the answer is, "Yes." Baptism is a highpoint for me, because it reflects the divine encounter between us and God. The way we practice baptism rests on human agency. Each person decides about the time to get baptized, and in our church, no one (I hope) pressures anyone to make that decision.

Human agency rests on freedom. We only have agency if we are free. In baptism, someone decides to seek it. Then, we put the plans in motion. Rev. Deal plans a worship service around the sacrament. Thomas fills the baptistry and knows exactly when to turn the heater on. On Sunday morning, Alan turns the heater off, so we don't have the sound of it humming during worship. Each person makes a choice to participate in this holy ritual.

When we reach the moment of baptism in a worship service, it's wet, messy, and never goes exactly the way we plan. It doesn't matter if I stand in the baptistry with someone and go through the choreography. When we get to that moment, there are final stage directions. "Move over here." "Stand there." "Hold your nose." The last one includes the implied instruction, "Hold your nose so you won't be sputtering and choking."

We get to see someone growing in Christ right in front of our eyes. Baptism is an outward sign of an inner change, and we all get to see it.

I hope the joy of <u>last Sunday's worship</u> is sustaining you through this week.



As a GraceInside chaplain, I am dedicated to meeting the spiritual needs of all residents of Virginia's state prisons. I currently serve in Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women, providing one-on-one pastoral care, conducting worship services, and working with the Department of Corrections staff in offering rehabilitative programs. I am also responsible for scheduling all religious programs conducted by volunteers representing many faith traditions.

Dinner with Andrew

One of the members of our church family has been raising funds to address food insecurity every year since July 2001. On January 1, 2001, Colleen Baber's son Andrew choked on a gummy candy and did not survive. He had been working at Domino's Pizza at the time, and his coworkers wanted to do something to honor his memory. They chose a food drive which fit well with honoring Andrew because few people liked to eat more than he did. Thus, "Dinner with Andrew" began.

This year is the twenty-fourth year Colleen has been collecting donations in Andrew's memory. In 2020, she switched from collecting and sorting food to taking donations for food gift cards. She gives these cards to families in extreme need through The Jefferson Area Food Bank, The Salvation Army, The Emergency Food Bank, and ARC. We can help address food insecurity and be the hands and feet of Christ by supporting this ministry. As the temperature gets cooler and the leaves change color, I am reminded that God's mercies are new every morning. God continues to work patiently in our lives, transforming us, and sanctifying us to the likeness of the image of God's Son, Jesus. What an honor it is to partner with the Savior bringing faith, hope, and love to incarcerated men and women. As Christ says in Matthew 25, "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me."

Bio: Chaplain Tiller is an ordained Baptist minister. She completed her master's degree in divinity and a doctorate degree in ministry at the Baptist Theological Seminary in Richmond. She majored in biblical studies and obtained a master's degree in theology at the Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, Virginia. She taught World Religions as adjunct faculty at Virginia Commonwealth University. Her doctoral project was in the field of grief and loss. She lives in Richmond with her seventeen-year-old daughter, a stage 4 cancer survivor, and her husband Martin Tiller and his daughter. Her grandparents were a major influence on her life. They retired from the Department of Corrections in India and told her bedtime stories of their work in Corrections. The stories took deep root in her impressionable heart and are the reason for her passion for prison ministry today.

Worship+Wonder



Greetings! Thank you all for your wonderfully warm welcome these past for weeks! I am so delighted to be joining the ministry team and working with the children and youth at UBC!

This Sunday, during the children's sermon time, we will begin something new called Worship+Wonder. Based on the Godly Play model, Worship+Wonder will be a special time for children to worship by exploring God's story and wondering about what it means to them. For our first Worship+Wonder, I will share with the children, on the floor in the sanctuary, The Parable of the Mustard Seed. In that story, something great grows from something small. You might notice the ample silence and sense of mystery in this kind of storytelling. It may even seem like I have left out the lesson of the story! That's because Worship+Wonder gives children an opportunity to construct their own meaning out of the essential stories of the Bible and the church. This helps them form stronger connections to those stories than anything we grownups might want to tell them. It asks them to encounter, experience, and explore the stories. My hope is that the telling of this familiar story in a new way invites all of us to think about it more deeply.

Beginning next Sunday, Aug 18, 2024, I will gather school-aged children (K-5) midway through Morning Worship to climb the stairs to the right of the front of the sanctuary and into our children's ministry space for Worship+Wonder. I am busy preparing a special space for our worship and wondering time together. Near the end of the service, I will send the children back down to join the parents or grandparents (aunts, uncles, etc...) who brought them to worship. In future articles, I'll be sharing more about Worship+Wonder and other activities of the children and youth ministries at UBC. See you on Sunday! -Elizabeth
