Otium Sanctum: Experiencing the Divine in Moments of Leisure

These are tumultuous times. Just a quick look at the news will provide plenty of examples. Beyond the news, we all have ups and downs in our lives. During turmoil, the psalmist reminds us that "God is our refuge." What seems like turmoil today can be nothing tomorrow--we might look back and laugh--or it can be a bitter memory that takes a lifetime to get over. Either way, God is with us in the middle of it all, and when the storm clouds begin to gather on the horizon, the psalmist writes, "Be still and know that God is God." The act of "being still" is an extreme challenge, because we place such great value on productivity. On Wednesday, we will explore otium sanctum. Otium Sanctum is "holy leisure," and it is an affront to the value we place on productivity. Psalm 46:10, "Be still and know that I am God," reminds us to calm down and embrace "holy leisure." Come to church on Wednesday to learn about otium sanctum and how to experience it.

Sharing the Light

COVID hit institutions hard: schools, childcare programs, hospitals, retirement homes, nursing homes, and prisons were affected. At Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women, we had additional challenges like staffing shortage of both officers and volunteers, and as a result our religious programs were affected. Our program numbers dwindled as schedules shifted and older preachers refrained from entering the prison systems. Inmates struggled to find the strength to beat these challenges.

Life does not have to be perfect to be wonderful. In the summer of 2023, after the worst wave of COVID passed, 38 inmates recommitted their lives to Christ. Some accepted Jesus for the very first time. Both Protestants and Messianic Jews reached out to me to be baptized in the "pool" we have in the chaplain's office. Today, 6 months later, looking at these pictures, I see inmate Byrd who passed away last week after an illness. She testified to the saving grace of Jesus in her life while she was doing well. She gave her witness in our church of 100 inmates every time she was discharged from the hospital. He who began a good work in us is faithful to complete it, in due season. Weeping may last for a night, but joy comes in the morning.

Dinner with Andrew

One of the members of our church family has been raising funds to address food insecurity every year since July 2001. On January 1, 2001, Colleen Baber's son Andrew choked on a gummy candy and did not survive. He had been working at Domino's Pizza at the time, and his coworkers wanted to do something to honor his memory. They chose a food drive which fit well with honoring Andrew because few people liked to eat more than he did. Thus, "Dinner with Andrew" began.

This year is the twenty-fourth year Colleen has been collecting donations in Andrew's memory. In 2020, she switched from collecting and sorting food to taking donations for food gift cards. She gives these cards to families in extreme need through The Jefferson Area Food Bank, The Salvation Army, The Emergency Food Bank, and ARC. We can help address food insecurity and be the hands and feet of Christ by supporting this ministry. in biblical studies and obtained a master's degree in theology at the Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, Virginia. She taught World Religions as adjunct faculty at Virginia Commonwealth University. Her doctoral project was in the field of grief and loss. She lives in Richmond with her seventeen-year-old daughter, a stage 4 cancer survivor, and her husband Martin Tiller and his daughter. Her grandparents were a major influence on her life. They retired from the Department of Corrections in India and told her bedtime stories of their work in Corrections. The stories took deep root in her impressionable heart and are the reason for her passion for prison ministry today.
