On Sunday, I asked, "What do we need more of?" At first, I offered some suggestions (water, food, and clean habitats for nature). However, in the end, we need more love. James writes, "Faith without works is dead" (James 2:17), so what we believe *must* connect with what we do. If we say we believe something, but don't live like it, our belief isn't real. It's dead.

Since Sunday, I have been thinking about how we can be more loving. It seems like living this belief comes down to micro-interactions. Each encounter and each exchange is an opportunity to be more loving. In every moment, we can make a choice. Do I want to be loving, joyful, peaceful, patient, kind, generous, faithful, gentle, and self-controlled (Galatians 5:22-23)? Or do I want to be something else?

When we fall short, and we all will, we can extend the same grace we give to others to ourselves. Letting yourself off the hook takes away the baggage of guilt and shame. The gospel message isn't about feeling bad. It's about transformation in Christ. As new beings in Christ, we strive to follow his ways. Sometimes we succeed. Other times we don't. In either case, the choices we make are about *this moment*, not reliving past mistakes.

The world needs more love. Each one of us has the chance to be part of this love in every moment of every day.





"The Great Dechurching"

It is greater than the First and Second Great Awakening and every revival in our country combined...but in the opposite direction. Yet precious little rigorous study has been done on the broad

phenomenon of dechurching in America. Jim Davis and Michael Graham have commissioned the largest and most comprehensive study of dechurching in America by renowned sociologists Dr. Ryan Burge and Dr. Paul Djupe.

The Great Dechurching takes the insights gleaned from this study to drill down on how exactly people are dechurching with respect to beliefs, behavior, and belonging.

This book gives the church in America its first ever deep dive into the dechurched phenomenon. You'll learn about the dechurched through a detailed sketch of demographics, size, core concerns, church off-ramps, historical roots, and the gravity of what is at stake. Then you'll explore what can be done to slow the bleed, engage the pertinent issues winsomely and wisely, and hopefully re-church some of the dechurched.

Dinner with Andrew

One of the members of our church family has been raising funds to address food insecurity every year since July 2001. On January 1, 2001, Colleen Baber's son Andrew choked on a gummy candy and did not survive. He had been working at Domino's Pizza at the time, and his coworkers wanted to do something to honor his memory. They chose a food drive which fit well with honoring Andrew, because few people liked to eat more than he did. Thus, "Dinner with Andrew" began.

This year is the twenty-fourth year Colleen has been collecting donations in Andrew's memory. In 2020, she switched from collecting and sorting food to taking donations for food gift cards. She gives these cards to families in extreme need through The Jefferson Area Food Bank, The Salvation Army, The Emergency Food Bank, and ARC.
